2017 ORDINARY LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION



The October ordinary election is a postal election and you should have received your postal vote package by now. You can submit your vote via Australia post any time up until election day. Which leaves no need to attend a polling booth on election day. If you have made an error on your ballot paper or damaged

your package you can apply for a replacement voting package at the Shire office. Replacement packages are also available at the Beacon Library when Karrie is in attendance on Wednesdays.

Should you need to vote on election day a polling booth will be open in Council Chambers as per normal between 8am and 6pm. A polling booth will be available in Beacon between 9am and 2pm. The votes will be counted directly after 6pm and the results will be placed on our website and Facebook page as soon as practicable.

CORPORATE BUSINESS PLAN AND LONG TERM FINANCIAL PLAN

Bush Fire Act 1954 Restricted Burning Period

All burning is restricted in the Shire of Mt Marshall from Tuesday 19 September 2017 to Tuesday 31 October 2017. During this time a Permit to Burn is required.

Farmers are advised that permits will only be issued on a daily basis and are reminded that certain conditions are endorsed on the permit. One important condition is that burning cannot be carried out on the day if a Very High or Extreme Fire Danger has been issued.



Please check BOM website for further information or contact your nearest Bush Fire Control Officer.

Permit holders are also reminded to read the "Obligations of the permit holder" prior to burning.

FIRE BREAKS

Landowners are also reminded that Firebreaks are to be constructed by Saturday 1 October 2017. Firebreak inspections will be carried out by Shire staff and the contract ranger with notices being issued to landowners if their firebreaks do not comply.

BURNING WHICH MAY BE DONE DURING THE RESTRICTED PERIOD WITHOUT A PERMIT:

Burning of garden refuse and rubbish

Garden refuse and rubbish may be burnt at any time, day or night, in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material.

Garden refuse and rubbish burnt on the ground may be burnt only between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and 11 o'clock of the same day and must be completely extinguished no later than midnight on that day. At all times while burning garden refuse please ensure that you do not leave the fire unattended and you have running water available.

<u>First and FINAL Notice — BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954 (as amended)</u>

Notice to all owners and / or occupiers of land in the Shire of Mt Marshall:

Notice is hereby given to landowners and / or occupiers within the Shire of Mt Marshall that firebreaks must be installed by 1 October and maintained clear of inflammable material up to and including 15 March as per the requirements in relation to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

Agricultural Land

Clear a firebreak consisting of mineral earth, to a width of no less than 3 metres, as close as practical, inside the external boundaries of the property.

Firebreaks must be maintained to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum 3.5 metres as to allow adequate access for fire appliances.

An approved fire fighting appliance is required to be present in any paddock where crop harvesting, straw raking or hay bailing is being carried out. The fire fighting appliance must be in a state of readiness and have a minimum capacity of 400 litres of water.

Harvesting is permitted on Sundays and all public holidays, with the exception of Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Years Day.

Town Sites

All town site lots within the Shire of Mt Marshall shall be cleared of all debris of an inflammable nature and be maintained free of such material.

Fuel Ramps and Depots

All grass and similar inflammable material to be cleared from areas where drum ramps or bulk fuel are located and where drums, full or empty are stored and such areas are maintained clear of grass and similar inflammable materials.

Variation to firebreak notices

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from land as required by the notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements in this notice.

Harvest / Movement of Vehicle Bans

A ban on harvesting and the movement of vehicles in paddocks may be imposed when the predicted weather conditions are classified by the Bureau of Meteorology as very high or extreme, or when local conditions warrant bans to be applied.

All such bans are at the discretion of the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer or a duly appointed person.

Failure to comply with this notice shall subject the offender to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fires Act 1954. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954.
