# 2014/115 COUNCIL DECISION / OFFICER RECOMMENDATION:

That:

- 1. The Shire of Mt Marshall grants approval to commence development for an extractive industry at Location 15112 (Volume 508 Folio 644) Luckman Road for Whitestone Quarries W.A. Pty Ltd for the purpose of extracting Feldspar and Quartz in accordance with the development application dated 27 June 2014, subject to the following conditions:
  - a) To activate the planning approval, the development subject to this approval must be SUBSTANTIALLY COMMENCED within a period of two (2) years of the date of this approval notice. If the

development is not substantially commenced within this period, this approval shall lapse and be of no further effect. Where an approval has lapsed, no development shall be carried out without the further approval of the Shire having first been sought and obtained;

- b) The development shall be carried out only in accordance with the terms of the planning application as approved herein (11.1.4);
- c) Where a permit is required under the provisions of the Building Act 2011 and Building Regulations 2012, all relevant approvals and/or requirements to be satisfied prior to the lodgement of a building permit application with the Permit Authority prior to the commencement of any building works on-site;
- d) The approval is valid for 15 years with a review every three years of performance against the approved management plans and the complaints register by the Shire of Mt Marshall;
- e) Within three (3) months of planning approval that an 'Operations Management Plan', 'Environmental Management Plan (which is to include a Waste Management Plan, Water Management Plan, Dust Management Plan and Noise Management Plan), 'Traffic Management Plan', 'Rehabilitation and Closure Plan' and a 'Dewatering Plan' to be submitted to the Shire of Mt Marshall and to be approved by Council;
- f) The Shire of Mt Marshall to be notified within 10 working days when the water table has been reached in the extractive pit area;
- g) The approved management plans to be reviewed and updated every 3 years from date of formal approval of the extractive industry and submitted together with the complaints register to the Shire of Mt Marshall for review. The Shire to notify the landowner and operator within 3 months of receipt of the updated plans if amendment to these plans is required or if the extractive industry operations should cease;
- h) No excavation or associated operations and facilities to occur outside of Portion of Avon Location 15112 as shown on the plan endorsed by the Shire of Mt Marshall. Any change to the extractive industry boundary will require the approval of Council;
- i) The hours of operation of the extractive industry shall be limited to daylight hours Monday to Sunday;
- j) No blasting to occur prior to the Shire of Mt Marshall receiving a copy of all necessary approvals under the Dangerous Goods Safety Act 2004 and Dangerous Goods Safety (Explosives) Regulations 2007;
- k) No blasting to occur until all immediate neighbours to Lot 15112 have been duly notified beforehand and that residences located within a 10 kilometre radius have also been notified 24 hours beforehand, records of notifications are to be provided to the Shire of Mt Marshall on request and as part of the three (3) yearly review of extractive industry operations;
- Blasting shall be limited to hours of 0900Hrs to 1600Hrs Monday to Friday (limited period) unless the Shire has been given 10 working days prior notice of an alternative time;

| m) Activities on the site to comply with the Environmental Protection |

- n) Vehicle access onto the site shall be restricted to that shown on the Shire of Mt Marshall approved site plan;
- o) The area of the extractive industry as detailed on the Shire of Mt Marshall approved site plans to be fenced with at least a stock proof fence and gate(s) as required;
- p) A \$1,000 per year contribution made for road maintenance in accordance with the approved Traffic Management Plan;
- q) A bond of \$5,000 for the rehabilitation and closure of the site has been lodged with the Shire of Mt Marshall;
- r) The facility and the operations of the facility are demonstrated to be compliant with the Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984 and Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996;
- s) Chemicals, fuel, explosives and other similar substances to be stored in accordance with Department of Mines and Petroleum;
- t) The maintenance of a complaints register that includes the date received, name of complainant, nature of the complaint and response to the complaint. Complaints to be forwarded to the Shire of Mt Marshall within one (1) month of receipt;
- u) Setbacks in accordance with the Shire of Mt Marshall Local Planning Scheme N°3 and State Planning Policy 3.1 'R Codes 'are to be maintained at all times or as negotiated and approved by the Shire of Mt Marshall;
- v) That a minimum setback of 1,000 metres is maintained from the Shire of Mt Marshall approved extractive area for future sensitive land uses;
- w) Signage at the Luckman Road entrance of Location 15112 and the rear and side boundaries indicating that unauthorised access is prohibited due to extractive and blasting activity;
- x) The Shire to be notified of the intention to temporarily cease operations for a period of 6 months or more and/or renew operations.
- 2. That:
  - a) The Shire of Mt Marshall is to carry out compliance inspections as required ensuring compliance with the planning approval conditions;
  - b) When enacted, a local law pertaining to extractive industry will apply in addition to this approval.

# BACKGROUND:

On the 27 June 2014 the Shire of Mt Marshall received a formal planning application for an extractive industry by Whitestone Quarries WA Pty Ltd of Muchea to be located on Location 15112 Luckman Road Bencubbin (11.1.4a). The planning application is to be assessed on the details of the type and size of the extractive industry and any

affect to amenity with the Shire of Mt Marshall Local Planning Scheme N°3 (LPS) and Local Planning Strategy.

# COMMENT:

An Industry – Extractive is listed for a 'Rural' zoned area as 'D' being 'Discretionary' land use; this means that the use is not permitted unless the local government has exercised its discretion by granting planning approval. In assessing a land use in the context of 'Discretionary' the local government will have regard to the matters set out in clause 10.2. of the Town Planning Regulations 1967 'Model Scheme Text Appendix B' (MST) which forms part of the Shire of Mt Marshall Local Planning Scheme N°3 as a referenced document. The Council can invite consultation as appropriate pursuant to clause 10.1. of the LPS which will be guided by the planning application and the areas requiring more detail and referral and also meeting the LPS clause 10.2. Advertising is also an option at Councils disposal. The main points for Councils consideration are detailed further in this report.

The proposal is to establish an extractive industry on Avon Location 15112 (Volume 508 Folio 644) Luckman Road by Whitestone Quarries W.A. Pty Ltd for the purpose of extracting Feldspar and Quartz which is used in decorative concrete and stone. Location 15112 is owned by Sachse Farming Pty Ltd ATF Sachse Farming Trust and there exists an agreement with Whitestone Quarries W.A. Pty Ltd to lease a portion of Location 15112 for the purpose of extraction commencing 1 January 2013. The extraction of feldspar and quartz is listed in the planning application as between 5,000 and 10,000 tonnes. The planning application details and supporting documents are all included in attachment 11.1.4b.

This report will outline the pertinent details of this planning application which is to assist Council in considering this planning application and is as follows:

**Road Access and Vehicle Movements:** The annual production is declared as being 5,000 to 10,000 tonnes per year. Information supplied by the applicant uses an average of 7,500 tonnes per year which when divided into a 79 tonne load for a Pocket Road Train (PRT) is around 95 movements per year. Based on the maximum production of 10,000 tonnes this would equate to 126 PRT movements per year.

Discussions with the Shire of Mt Marshall Works Supervisor who consulted with Mr R Munns of R Munns Engineer Consultancy Service indicated that as long as the movements were restricted to 1 to 2 PRT movements per week '...there would be no <u>significant damage</u> to either Luckman or Welbungin-Wialki roads. Worst case scenario would be that the section of road they are using might need an extra grade during the year'. This is an important consideration as the PRT movements are based on an average and should more movements occur then the road can deteriorate above normal use patterns and needs to be considered.

The route proposed to be used by the PRT from Location 15112 is quoted as:

"exit the site turn left into Luckman Road, then turn left into Welbungin-Wialki Road, then turn right into Koorda-Bullfinch Road, then Bencubbin, then Koorda, then Wongan Hills, then Calingiri, then Great Northern Highway, then Muchea".

It is noted in the application that the PRT movements '...usually slows...' during the winter months as well as Christmas and New Year. A traffic management plan has been offered should the extractive operation be approved and this will form part of the approval conditions.

**Vegetation:** Noted as low scrub '…little or no environmental value' furthermore it states that 'The site does not contain any rare and endangered flora or fauna'. No environmental report to substantiate this claim has been submitted with the application and the Shire of Mt Marshall no longer has the availability of a Natural Resource Officer to undertake such an assessment. The land in question does form part of the larger agricultural area and is generally flat and exhibiting little significant vegetation other than pockets of scrub and/or trees.

**Extraction activity of site:** The proposed extractive activity site is declared as being approximately 30 acres in size and is shown in the planning application Annexure G. No further plans are provided showing a detailed excavation layout, contours and access and ingress into the extraction area, also site buildings, water points, storage and dams are not shown.

The extraction activity involves blasting with explosives to enable sourcing of the insitu feldspar and quartz. Followed by excavation, processing (by mobile crusher), stockpiling of the feldspar and quartz before transport onto PRTs and cartage to the receival point in Muchea. The blasting by explosives is done by a third party contractor and in accordance with State Government Regulations covering such matters. The blasting cycle is 4 to 6 weeks as needed and each blast reveals approximately 2 tonnes of material ranging between 1.5 to 2 tonnes. Based on a maximum extraction per annum of 10,000 tonnes this would range between 5,000 to 6,666 blasts per year condensed into 4 to 6 week cycles.

Crushing and screening of quarry material is done by a mobile crushing unit located in the Shire of Mukinbudin Whittle road operations. The crushing and screening activity will be on equipment transported from the Whittle road site for '...the foreseeable future...'.

The operations will occur 7 days a week '...during daylight hours...'. The extraction site plan 'active pit area' is referenced in Annexure G, again lacking more detail other than a line drawn with no further details of extraction pit location. It is noted in the application that '...the pit area is likely to vary slightly from the areas depicted on the plans' and this will need careful monitoring. The estimated lifespan of the extraction site is in excess of 15 years.

**Proximity of Sensitive Uses:** The application reports that the size and location of the extractive industry will have minimal impact on surrounding areas and residences. It is stated that the nearest residence to the proposed operations is located approximately 10 kilometres away and is '...considered appropriate...' yet discussions with the Work Supervisor indicates that there are other residences in the area within the 10 kilometre radius. It is not known if adjoining farmers and/or residences have been notified of the proposed extractive industry and the type of operations to be undertaken. There is reference to the equipment used for excavation being new and well maintained '...which minimise noise generation' and further that the noise is similar to that of farm

machinery although no evidence to support this has been submitted with the application.

A reference is made to conditions imposed by DER for blasting, screening and crushing yet as mentioned before DER does not require a license for extractive activities under 50,000 tonnes. It does mention that noise levels will be as per the *Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997* which are enforced by local government by an authorised officer which the Shire of Mt Marshall does not yet have. Complaints received by the Shire of Mt Marshall requires significant amount of time for investigation and administration. Vibration from blasting activity can be expected and is referenced to being regulated by the Mines Department Regulations. The application does refer to complaints regarding noise and vibration being reported to the site manager.

Buffer distances for development in Rural zoned areas under the Shire of Mt Marshall Local Planning Scheme N°3 are set at 'R2' as per the Residential Design Codes which is a setback from the front of the property of 20m and 10m for secondary and side and rear setbacks but are negotiable. There is reference in the application to buffer distances from sensitive land uses quoting '...hard rock quarrying is 300 - 500 metres', yet research indicates this is actually set at 1,000m. Buffer distances should be able to be achieved due to the location of the proposed extractive industry in the rural area.

**Pre extraction site works:** Overburden has been determined to be '...limited...' and in some areas on site non-existent and, it is reported that there does exist overburden at 1,000mm depth but when assessed across the whole proposed site it is limited. Thus will prove an issue when the extractive activity ceases and rehabilitation is commenced in part mainly due to the extractive pit area. The clearing of vegetation is mentioned although the site is very limited in flora as aforementioned. There is reference to '...the company will obtain a Department of Environment Regulation (DER) License' in reference to the need for a clearing permit; investigations undertaken by this offer reveals that DER does not require a license for an extractive activity under 50,000 tonnes therefore is a moot point.

**Employment:** The Shire of Mt Marshall Local Planning Strategy identifies attracting employment opportunities into the Shire of Mt Marshall by encouraging activities that will generate such employment. An extractive industry is best located away from population centres and this application meets that Strategic objective. The application details the employment and economic benefit and mentions there is scope for up to three persons to be employed locally and in the broader community. Depending on the commercial success of this extractive endeavour further employment opportunities may become available.

Visual amenity: Minimal due to location and distance from dwellings.

**Rehabilitation of extractive activity site:** The stated objective post extractive activity is to re-contour and revegetate the land which will suit the non-pit areas; there is little detail on the proposed rehabilitation of the extractive pit. The proposed extractive pit is stated as to be as deep as 60.96 metres although email confirmation is '...Whitestone Quarries WA Pty Ltd would not attempt to undertake Extractive Industry Operations below the water table' and this can present rehabilitation challenges

especially as the aim is '...to facilitate the use of the land for agricultural purposes or other suitable rural uses' of which the uses are undefined in the documents provided.

**Site Rehabilitation:** The documentation provided explains that the site will have stockpiles and equipment removed and that the excavation area will be backfilled with stockpiled overburden. The removed topsoil, of which it is earlier reported to be minimal, will be placed on the overburden. As the depth of the pit is noted to be as deep as 60.96 metres with the governor being the water table which is unknown, the pit will remain a significant depression in the ground when measured against the surrounding rural area. It is stated the 'overburden will be sufficient although no supporting documentation has been provided.

There is a statement in the documentation '...land will be contoured into a gentle slope and a small depression will be formed...' although it does not distinguish between the extractive pit and/or the designated area of extractive operations as shown in Annexure G. There is a reference to '...will be formed from the Department of Environment Regulation Commissioned pits' which needs further explanation and as mentioned , due to total tonnage being less than 50,000 tonnes the DER does not required a registration, license or a commission.

**Revegetation:** Again in the documentation there is reference to DER commissioned pits (plural) and this will need further explanation. The proposed vegetation to be planted is said to be that which is indigenous to the area and a list is provided which has been reviewed by the Natural Resource Officer Ms C Baker (Koorda, Wyalkatchem & Mukinbudin NRM Scheme) and found that listed tree species will need a review in order to ensure they are suitable to the area and are available. It is further mentioned that '...a more detailed rehabilitated plan prepared based on final contours and areas' will be prepared which will need addressing to ensure there is a formal rehabilitation plan in place to the satisfaction of the Shire of Mt Marshall. There is reference to irrigation not being required although if required can be sourced from dams although no dams are identified on the provided maps or plans to build one.

The rehabilitation with vegetation has an implied caveat being '...the aim of rehabilitation is to revegetate with the same density of trees as was previously present' which is at odds with other text in the document which claims the area is land used for agriculture and trees are very sparsely if at all present which is reflected in the LandGate mapping for Location 15112. Also to mitigate weeds it is stated that plant, soil or fill material are not to be brought onto the extractive activity site which is of concern as this can preclude bringing in extra overburden and topsoil for rehabilitation. The DER is nominated as the monitor for weeds onsite which is not appropriate as the DER does not require a license, register or commission for this proposed activity therefore will be the responsibility of the person implementing the revegetation plan. It is stated that when weeds are found they should be burned, buried or removed although no details on who will have this responsibility.

**Final site clean-up:** Wastes are to be taken to an approved waste disposal site and this will need careful monitoring as landfill lifespan could be affected by volumes which are presently unknown.

**Complaints:** This is focused on noise complaints only and not dust, onsite water dispersal controls and blasting activity and will need to be addressed. The first point of contact is with the site manager which is good practice yet ultimately complaints unresolved can and will be received by the Shire of Mt Marshall for investigation.

The planning application before Council has merit although some areas need clarification and detail and these are addressed in the planning conditions to be recommended.

# COMMENT:

Colas WA have suggested that serious consideration be given to use a higher quality sealing aggregate from Hanson Red Hill for the two reseal sites. The additional cost to utilise this material is \$5082.00 which is still within budget allocations.

It is anticipated that the reseal program and shoulder widening will be completed in November 2014 and final two projects in March 2015.

No later than 31 August in each year council must approve a financial budget for the financial year. The proposed budget for the 2014/2015 financial year is presented to council as attached. It meets the requirements of the Local Government Act 1995.

# COMMENT:

Key outcomes of the proposed budget are as follows:

Net Cash provided by operating activities\$1.004 millionNet cash expenditure on creation of assets\$0.936 millionRepayment of debt\$0.122 millionAppropriation to reserves for future expenditure\$0.589 million

The proposed budget includes a rates increase of 5 percent for the 2014/2015 financial year, in accordance with Council's Long Term Financial Plan. Other revenue and expense items have been provided for essentially on either a zero based methodology or by trending on previous years activities and including known factors likely to impact on the current year budget.

Projects included in the budget may include construction or maintenance of roads in the vicinity of residential or farming properties in which Councillors or related persons have an interest. Councillors are requested to consider where such works are contemplated and declare a proximity interest if appropriate.

The process of preparing the budget has included consultation with Council staff and community groups, plus an inspection of the Shire and a working group meeting involving Councillors, staff and consultants responsible for early preparation of the budget.

The financial model on which the budget has been based has been checked and its integrity as a modelling tool verified.

No review of Councils long term or operating plans has been conducted prior to budget preparation and it is recommended that this be undertaken once Council's new CEO commences and prior to a review of the budget.

The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 require that a half yearly review be conducted during the period 1 January to 31 March and that review be submitted to, and considered by, Council.

Council may also wish to consider as a future policy platform preparing the draft budget earlier in the financial year and submitting it to its stakeholders for public consultation prior to final adoption.
