BACKGROUND:

In April 2010 Council was invited by the Department of Regional Development and Lands to apply for funding to undertake a study of a five year Forward Capital Works Plan.

Council successfully sought funding totalling \$35,000 [from the 2009/10 Country Local Government Fund (CLGF)] to engage a consultant to undertake the plan which is limited to infrastructure planning only. It excludes plant, furniture and equipment.

The agreement with the Department of Regional Development and Lands requires Council to adopt a Forward Capital Works Plan, which includes priorities for projects, and for the Plan to be submitted to that Department by no later than 31 December 2010.

For the information of Councillors, the Department of Regional Development will not release any further Country Local Government Funds monies to any Council which does not complete and adopt a Forward Capital Works Plan and submit a copy to them.

COMMENTS:

A draft Forward Capital Works Plan has now been completed by Council's consultant, as attached.

Supplied within the Forward Capital Works Plan document is an 'Affordability Summary', outlining what has been included in the draft Plan is achievable and affordable.

The Plan includes the estimated gross costs and identifies the expected sources of funding. For certain items, provision has been made for the ongoing costs relating to the particular item, as well as provision of annual allocations of monies to be set aside into Reserves for the renewal costs relating to various new projects.

As can be expected, roads are the major items and they are prominent in every year.

The adjusted annual operating figures have been prepared on known data as at 8 December 2010, and should be viewed as being optimistic and a 'best case' scenario. For example, Council's FAGs grant increase for the current year were just over 7% for the untied portion and about 5.5% for the road allocation, and these have been extended into the following 4 years. There is a chance that this may well be the case, but the Grants Commission is currently assessing whether it should change its formulas for the calculations of such grants, and this could possibly have detrimental effects on the allocations to this Council. Also, Councils in regional WA are fortunate in receiving Royalties for Regions grants, and the Mount Marshall Shire will receive \$1,229,082 over a 3 years period. As well, the will be monies going into a 'regional' fund of at least \$744,898 of which Council may be able to access. The latter money may possibly be used to construct additional Aged Units.

The attached draft Plan includes a 'Version 4' Summary which is printed on an A3 fold out sheet, and it allocates equal funds to each Beacon and Bencubbin. These are shown in totals in the lower part of the sheet, with the items for Beacon highlighted in grey, and the items for Bencubbin are highlighted in light blue.

At each meeting it was advised that there may be funds totalling at least \$1 million available to each town and the latest projections are that as much as \$1.5 million could be available for each town, between year 2 and the end of year 5 [2014/15].

The consultant has stated that Council should consider renewal or replacement of existing items, before considering any extra assets. For the information of Councillors, the draft Plan includes lists of all of Council's buildings. Renewal costs over the next 10-15 years could be quite high, and planning for those should be done over the next 6 months.

Each meeting was asked for projects it's community members felt were important, and to then prioritise to those items. The items proposed at the meeting at Beacon are included in the draft Plan on light green paper, and the items for Bencubbin are on dark green paper.

The consultant stated that he was surprised with some of the priorities allocated at the Bencubbin meeting, as they don't appear to have any emphasis on Economic Development. He stated that he believed that the Mobile/Broadband coverage is important to those people wanting to run a business via the internet, as well as easy access to world wide information. He also stated that the Industrial Land development, adjacent to Bencubbin Seed Cleaners, should be a project of high priority, and the relocation of the Caravan Park would also free up Industrial land.

The consultant engaged for this project, Mr John Crothers of LG Consulting Services Pty Ltd, will be in attendance at the December Ordinary Meeting of Council to explain the various details.

COMMENT:

At the commencement of her employment at the Shire of Mt Marshall, the previous NRM Officer had some carryover projects to complete. These are now mostly complete, although recurring tasks such as tree production, bore monitoring etc. are ongoing.

There does not seem to be any overall environmental strategic plan for the Shire. This leads to a fragmented and reactive performance by staff as they do not have a clear idea of expectations.

In order that clear goals may be set for the next twelve months, it may be prudent to record what the Committee would like the present NRM Officer to focus on. Furthermore it will enable identification of shortfalls in order that assistance can be included within the budget.

An example would be tasks associated with the production of tree stock in the Community Nursery. If the NRM Officer is aware that other projects will be taking up her time when she should be thinning seedlings, provision can be made in the budget to allocate some of the gardener's time, or alternatively employ a casual to assist.

Both the Better Bencubbin Progress Association and past Junior Councillors have raised the issue of the current median strips along Monger Street, Bencubbin. Most people feel that they are unattractive and a more aesthetic solution needs to be considered.

The Better Bencubbin Progress Association in the past has suggested coloured concrete. I have received correspondence from Junior Councillor Wyatt and Junior Councillor R. Sachse suggesting colourful cement (possibly children's hand prints) along the edges with nice plants that flower on the inside.

COMMENT:

Plants used in the median strips need to be hardy, drought tolerant species that do not need much water to survive as too much water causes damage to the road surfaces. I suggest that I develop a plan and a design for both the Bencubbin Junior Councillors and the Better Bencubbin Progress Association to have input in to get the project completed before July 2011. There is money currently allocated in the budget for this project.

BACKGROUND:

Every day communities throughout WA are affected by either emergencies or disasters resulting in the loss of life, property and the environment. Personal tragedy impacts the community greatly which, in turn has a social impact on the communities that Local Government are responsible for. To ensure safer and sustainable communities, emergency management is not a choice for Local Government – it is a legislative requirement. Local Governments are obligated to understand and apply emergency management principles and actions in their day to day business planning. Section 36 and 38 of the Emergency Management Act describes some of the key functions that Local Governments are responsible for:

- (a) Ensuring effective local emergency management arrangements are prepared and maintained for its district
- (b) Managing recovery following an emergency affecting the communities in its district
- (c) Establishing one or more Emergency Management Committees for its district and
- (d) Performing other functions given to the Local Government under this Act.

Emergency Management in Local Government is now a core business requirement.

COMMENT:

In 2009 the Government of WA developed a guide to Local Emergency Management Arrangements. It was recognised that the Shire of Mt Marshall did not have a current "Plan" as was required by the Act. With the assistance of FESA, several members of the committee including the local police, bush fire services and shire staff met to draft a new "Plan" which is now presented to the committee for its approval and adoption. Several parts of the Plan are incomplete, but this can be included at a later date.

Thirty five percent of the Shire of Mt Marshall's Royalties for Regions funding goes to a regional pool for a regional purpose. NEWROC has decided to fund the NEWTravel Trail and associated tourism infrastructure. A business case needed to be prepared in order to receive the funding. If the six NEWROC shires contribute to the marketing expenses then the cost will be up to around \$20,000 per shire. The cost will be reduced to \$15,000 per shire if Dowerin and Westonia, who are NEW Travel members, also contribute.

COMMENT:

By building the trail, the Shire of Mt Marshall will receive considerable tourism infrastructure benefits. These benefits will outweigh the marketing expense that is required. There is some expense necessary in order to launch and market the trail in order to give it the best chance of succeeding.

The marketing expense appears to be slightly excessive however the full amount needs to be budgeted for just in case the marketing plan budget is fully expended.

BACKGROUND:

Recently Beacon Progress Association received a grant of \$206,914 to build a new building in Beacon that will be leased to the Beacon Co-operative to operate the Beacon Co-operative. Beacon Progress Association are seeking \$200,000 from the shire in order to have enough funds to complete the building.

Beacon Progress Association do not need the funds until around May however they are seeking an in principle agreement that the funds will be provided when required. There are three possible options for council providing the funds:

- Council to pay the funds out of this year's budget Due to the way that budgets are prepared, in order for council to use this option they will have to defer some budgeted capital projects or cancel transfers to reserves. An assessment at a later date would need to be made to see if this option is possible. The most likely deferral would be road projects however the ability to do so would depend on the completion level of the road program. The cash position of the shire would also need to be taken into account.
- 2. Short term loan The WA Treasury Corporation does provide short term loans over periods under six months. This would allow the funds to be raised without affecting the current budget or cash position of the shire. The loan

could then be paid back in the next budget cycle. A council resolution and public consultation period would be required.

3. Long term loan to be paid back by a specified area rate – This option has been raised previously. A loan will be taken out over a period of twenty years or more and a specified area rate will be levied on the northern portion of the shire to pay for the principle and interest over the term of the loan. A council resolution and public consultation period would be required.

COMMENT:

In the recent forward capital works program public consultation held in Beacon, a new building for the shop came in as their number one priority. As the 2010/2011 budget was already prepared, this would be put into the plan to be completed in the 2011/2012 budget period. By using one of these options it would merely move the shop project into the current budget year. Other items in the plan would not be moved forward.

Currently the Beacon Progress Association is only seeking in principle support however direction from council as to what option to pursue would be appreciated. This would allow proper planning to begin and necessary public consultation to be conducted.

BACKGROUND:

Cr Mervyn Shemeld handed in his letter of resignation from council which will be effective from 1 January 2011. This creates a vacancy on council.

An extraordinary election has to be held within four months of the office becoming vacant. The vacancy occurs when the CEO is given a signed and dated letter of resignation from the councillor. The latest that this election could be held is April 15 2011. It takes 70 days from when advertising for voter enrolments to the election day. Attached is a timeline of the election if it were to be held on 14 April 2011.

Council must also decide between running a postal election or in-person election. Only the Electoral Commission of WA is authorised to run a postal election. A quote received from the Electoral Commission to run the 2009 Ordinary Election as a postal election was \$6,818. The budget for running the 2009 Ordinary Election as an inperson election was \$3,120. It is estimated that advertising costs for both methods would be higher however wages in an in-person election would be reduced. In the 2009 ordinary election, there was still a voter turnout of over 80%.

Under Section 4.17(3) of the act, council can apply to the Electoral Commission to leave the vacancy unfilled until the next ordinary election. The next ordinary election will be held on the third Saturday of October 2011.

COMMENT:

It is legislated that statewide public notice is given for certain parts of the election. This is in the form of advertisements in The West Australian newspaper. Depending on what date is chosen, local advertising (The Bencubbin Gimlet and Beacon Bulletin) may not be available for the whole of the election. April 14 was chosen as the election date as this would enable advertisement in local papers to be run for almost the entire election. This would help to show that an open and fair election is being run.

Postal elections are normally run when there is a low voter turnout in order to try and increase voter participation. The cost of running a postal election is quite high. By running a postal election on a weekday, some costs can be saved by not having to pay a full day of overtime.

- 1. Council advises the Department of Regional Development and Lands that they are not aware of Reserve 22942 having been utilised for the purpose of 'Sheep Dip'; and
- 2. Council will not accept the reservation and management of Lots 17 and 18 South Street, Welbungin for the purpose of 'Sheep Dip'.

BACKGROUND:

A routine inspection of reserve 22942, Lot 34 Martin Street, Welbungin by the Department of Regional Development and Lands indicates that the sheep dip that was proposed for the reserve was constructed on the wrong land.

The sheep dip has been erected on unallocated crown land, Lots 17 and 18 South Street, Welbungin.

The Department of Regional Development and Lands are now enquiring as to confirmation of the reserving having been utilised for a sheep dip and if Council would accept the reservation and management of Lots 17 and 18 for the purpose of a sheep dip.

COMMENT:

Although I have recommended that Council does not accept management of the reserve, I am not sure if there will be any repercussions for the 'Road Board' constructing the sheep dip on the wrong property as it would now be classified as a contaminated site.

I am not aware of any significant heritage value of the site.
