3.0 Conduct of Meeting

The Presiding Member advised that the meeting had been convened in response to a petition containing signatures of electors that had been received under Section 5.25 of the Local Government Act 1995. The meeting will be run pursuant to Sections 5.30 and 5.31 of the Act. The Presiding Member made the following points:

- Mobile phones are to be switched off or switched to silent.
- Councillors are not obliged to attend Special Elector's Meetings but have chosen to do so to listen to the comments made by the residents of Mt Marshall.
- Only Electors can vote at the meeting and each elector should have a red card which is to be used when voting.
- Council is not bound by any decision made at the meeting.
- Pursuant to Sections 5.32 and 5.33 of the Local Government Act 1995, any
 motions passed by electors at the meeting will be referred (in the form of
 recommendations) to the next meeting of the Shire of Mt Marshall Council,
 or if this is not practicable, to the subsequent meeting of the Council.
- Electors will have an opportunity to ask questions and put motions in item six (6) of the Agenda.

- Each speaker must restrict their comments and questions to the subject of the meeting and will be allowed no more than 3 minutes.
- Speakers should not repeat comments / points already raised by another speaker. There will be the opportunity to voice support in the vote when any motion is put.
- Meeting protocol will be adhered to.
- The Local Government Act requires that a summary of questions and answers be included in the Minutes, therefore word for word Minutes will not be kept.

4.0 Purpose of Meeting

The meeting has been requested by the Shire of Mt Marshall electors under Section 5.28 of the Local Government Act 1995, to discuss the building and operational costs of the Bencubbin Multipurpose Complex as detailed in a petition and Form 1 received by Council.

PETITION TO CALL A SPECIAL ELECTORS MEETING OF THE SHIRE OF MT MARSHALL IN RELATION TO THE PROPOSED BUILDING AND OPERATIONAL COSTS OF THE NEW BENCUBBIN MULTIPURPOSE CENTRE

We the undersigned ratepayers and residents of the Shire of Mt Marshall, in the State of Western Australia, request that:

- 1. Further consultation and clearer communication by the Shire of Mt Marshall occur with regards to the proposed building of the Bencubbin Multipurpose Complex by means of a personally addressed survey of all the ratepayers and residents of the Mt Marshall Shire, stating clearly the financial implications of a project this size on our current and future finances, shire rates and our ability to consider other potential projects that may benefit the whole or other parts of the shire and then ask the following:
- A) Do you support the extensions to the Bencubbin Multipurpose Complex? Yes/No
- B) Do you support a specified area rate to be applied to the pre-determined zone South of Andrews Tank Rd to be raised to pay for this proposal?

The Presiding Member invited Mr Stuart Faulkner from the Beacon Progress Association (BPA) to address the meeting.

Mr Faulkner addressed the meeting covering issues that concerned the BPA including:

- Not enough community consultation had taken place regarding the financial implications of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex redevelopment.
- The Shire receiving a letter from the Department of Local Government and Communities (DLGC) regarding their financial concerns of the 2014/2015 audit.
- The Shire's operating losses over the last 3 years and the 2015/2016 Budget predicting the losses will continue.
- Questions as to why the President and CEO have stated there is "no better time to borrow"
- Auditors report shows a decrease in revenue with no decrease in spending
- The Shire's lack of plan to generate revenue from the proposed facility
- The future maintenance costs of the facility and who pays them.

2015/001 ELECTOR MOTION:

Further consultation and clearer communication by the Shire of Mt Marshal occur with regards to the proposed redevelopment of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex by means of a personally addressed survey of all the ratepayers and residents of the Mt Marshall Shire, stating clearly the financial implications of a project this size on our current and future finances, shire rates and our ability to consider other potential projects that may benefit the whole or other parts of the Shire and then ask the following:

A. Do you support the development of the Bencubbin Multipurpose Complex in its current form?

B. Do you support the funding plan which Council has adopted in the 2015/2016 budget for the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Redevelopment?

Moved Mr Stuart Faulkner Seconded Mrs Rachel Kirby Carried

2015/002 ELECTOR MOTION:

That the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Redevelopment be put on hold until all financial and social implications all financial and social implications can be properly considered and an appropriate amount of consultation with all stakeholders has occurred in line with the Shire of Mt Marshall's Corporate Plan, Business Plan and Asset Management Plan.

Moved Stuart Faulkner Seconded Mr Tom Grant Carried

Mr Tony Sachse addressed the meeting against the motion indicating he did not consider the use of the word 'stakeholder' appropriate. If the Shire was to consult every stakeholder it would take considerable time as the term 'stakeholder' is very broad terminology.

Mr Stuart Faulkner replied stating that by 'stakeholder he was referring to all residents and ratepayers of the Shire.

The Presiding member spoke against the motion referring to the consideration and that has taken place through the Shire's integrated planning. He also made mention of Council's decision at the September 2014 Ordinary Meeting of Council which was carried 7/0 to place the redevelopment of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex as the number one (1) recreation priority in the Shire. He believes the project will be of considerable benefit for the Shire.

Mr Dirk Sellenger spoke to the meeting regarding financial sustainability of the Shire. The Debt Service Ratio after the 2014/2015 financial year is now in excess of seven times the target ratio as set by the Department of Local Government. The Shire's Reserves now far exceed all previous balances increasing by approximately \$920,000 since 2012 representing an increase of over 78%.

The Presiding Member spoke regarding the ongoing costs of the facility:

- The electricity charges will be covered by users.
- The water will be paid for by the Shire.
- Ongoing maintenance will be minimal due to a new building for at least 10 years.

He also spoke regarding the loan repayments required of the Shire stating that the repayments are just 1% of Shire budget expenditure in the 2015/2016 year.

Mr Noel Miguel addressed the meeting. In summary he stated that 60% of the Shire's ratepayers are north of Andrews Tank Road and that people of Bencubbin will be getting the most use from the proposed facility. He believes a specified area rate should be applied and put the motion:

2015/003 ELECTOR MOTION:

The Shire of Mt Marshall raise a specified area rate to be applied to an area representative of the main users of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex, EG. South of Andrews Tank Road and excluding Eastern and Western ratepayers within approximately 8 klm of the Shire boundary, to fund the repayment of loans established for the proposed project.

Moved Noel Miguel Seconded Jenni Bunce Carried

Mr Tony Brown spoke to the meeting regarding specified area rates, explaining how they work. General areas are considered unsuitable to apply specified area rates too, however this is permitted.

Mr Tony Sachse spoke against the motion believing that setting specified area rates in regard to this project could set a precedence and should be treated with caution.

Mr Noel Miguel spoke for the motion stating that specified area rates have been used before around Beacon and can't see why they cannot be applied regarding this project.

Mrs Rachel Kirby put the following motion:

2015/004 ELECTOR MOTION:

That the scale of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Redevelopment project be staged to limit the expenditure development of Stage 1. to a maximum of \$1,980,000 including the \$990,000 NSRF funding. This meets the minimum requirement of the NSRF funding whole of Shire funded loan.

The matching dollar for dollar funding must come from sources other than a whole of Shire funded loan.

Moved Rachel Kirby

Seconded Megan Beagley

Carried

Mrs Rachel Kirby spoke for the motion and in summary stated that while the complex redevelopment was in the Shire's Long Term Planning the project was never planned to be this expensive. No funds have been put aside in preparation for the project. A loan such as this will put a large burden on the community. The Bencubbin Recreation Complex does need some renovations, yes. Does the project need to go ahead so soon, when we have until 2019 to complete the project?

Congratulations to the Shire Staff in being awarded such a large grant.

Mr Brett Millar spoke against the motion in summary stating that he believes that the longer the project is delayed then the less value for money the Shire will receive with this project.

Mr John Dunne addressed the meeting mentioning he didn't believe that using the Shire's reserve funds was appropriate.

The Presiding Member spoke for the motion stating in summary that due diligence had been taken in consideration of this project and staging the project will cause further delays. It is in the Shire's best interest to go ahead.

Mrs Megan Beagley put the following motion and addressed the meeting:

2015/005 ELECTOR MOTION:

That any further development of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex (such as that which is proposed in the Draft Sport and Recreation Master Plan) is to be carried out with thorough and effective communication and community consultation prior to any commitment of Shire funds, and that every possible effort is made to procure grants and external financial assistance towards this project before it can occur

Moved Megan Beagley Seconded Noel Miguel

Carried

In summary, Mrs Megan Beagley was concerned about the lack of consultation with the community, and believed the Shire had not made enough reference to the scale and magnitude of the project. Information about the project has not been forthcoming and the Councillors had not been given enough information to make an informed decision.

The Presiding Member spoke against the motion and in summary stated he believes the Shire carried out substantial communication.

Mrs Rachel Kirby put the following motion and addressed the meeting:

2015/006 ELECTOR MOTION:

That the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Redevelopment project budget be amended to use a maximum of \$291,000 reserve funds, including \$7000 from the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Reserve.

Moved Rachel Kirby

Seconded Stuart Faulkner

Carried

In summary Mrs Rachel Kirby stated that she believed the project could be funded differently and noted that building maintenance reserves were allocated to fund the project. Also of note was that the 2015/2016 Budget will result in a decrease in the reserve funds to \$1,600,000.

Mrs Kirby made mention of the Council's explanation at the August Council Meeting regarding a difference in the project budget of \$37,000 as 'rounding' and felt this was not appropriate.

No one spoke against the motion.

Mrs Jenni Bunce put the following motion and addressed the meeting:

2015/007 ELECTOR MOTION:

That the Mt Marshall Shire supply clear information which outlines the impact of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex Redevelopment on ratepayers. The rate increases, the rate comparisons and the total interest and maintenance costs to individual ratepayers before the project is to continue.

Moved Jenni Bunce

Mrs Bunce in summary stated that it had not been made clear what the actual cost of the project to the ratepayers would be.
