Summary of question from Mrs Melissa Beagley:

When does Council propose that an adequate aquatic facility will be available for the Mt Marshall community?

What timeline and/or specific plans will Council put into place to ensure that the necessary work is completed so that an aquatic facility will be reopened in the Mt Marshall Shire, irrespective of possible staff changes?

Summary of response from the Presiding Member:

The Presiding member advised Mrs Beagley that she cannot provide an accurate timeline for the reopening of a Mt Marshall Aquatic Facility. The timeline of the redevelopment or replacement of the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre began back when reports were obtained from consultants on the facility's condition. There is still a lot more research to be done including feasibility studies and a timeframe cannot be estimated at this stage. The Presiding Member then informed the meeting that it is hoped that the Strategic Community Plan currently being developed will give Council a little more direction in regards to this project.

The Acting CEO commented that he hopes to have an item to the December ordinary meeting of Council after receiving results of a geotechnical investigation on possible new aquatic centre sites. The Acting CEO further responded by saying that he believes the Shire will be in a place by next year's budget considerations to make a decision on the project and he also reiterated that the Shire will be engaging the services of an engineer and consultant to conduct a feasibility study of the project. He signalled a possible closure of the pool during the 2017/18 season also.

Summary of question from Mrs Melissa Beagley:

Is Council willing to forward the same courtesy to their community members as did the Mukinbudin Shire for theirs during the redevelopment of the Mukinbudin Aquatic Centre, by reimbursing receipted entry to local aquatic centres such as Koorda, Trayning and Mukinbudin, as they are no longer able to provide this service themselves?

Summary of response from the Presiding Member:

The Presiding Member advised Mrs Beagley that an instant answer is not available, however there are funds allocated in the 2016/2017 Budget for the operation of the Mt Marshal Swimming Pool which may be able to be redirected to the reimbursement of Mt Marshall community members patronage at nearby towns pools.

We will need to look at replacing the 2 boundary grids on Mouroubra Station. Along Mouroubra Road in that section there are 7 grids consisting of 5 internal grids and 2 boundary grids. From what I have been able to ascertain they have destocked most of the station and the internal grids are going to become obsolete.

I think if we concentrate on renewing the grid on the northern boundary and to encompass it into a Shire entry piece it will be killing 2 birds with one stone. The southern boundary is an obligation of the Shire to maintain but the station will need to upgrade the fence.

With the beginning of the harvest we are mobilising to rectify any weaknesses that are showing up in the roads with the extra traffic and also recording the specific areas that are failing for future maintenance upgrades.

Traffic counters are now in operation and the data that we collect will benefit the Shire of Mt Marshall with our future funding predictions into our 10 year plan.

Reason Council decision is different to officer recommendation: Council believes an arrangement reimbursing all Mt Marshall residents for their patronage at surrounding aquatic centres while the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre is not in operation is fair and reasonable.

BACKGROUND:

The condition of the existing Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre is known to be deteriorating, with the facility nearing the end of its useful life. The facility was opened for business in November 1976, this season would be its 40th year of operation. Since its establishment, various maintenance and repairs have been undertaken on the pool bowl and surrounds, most of which have occurred in the last 10 years. Nonetheless, the pool continues to lose substantial amounts of water with the poor floor displaying cracks and the water treatment system providing a poor water turnover rate.

The centre in its current form does not meet regulations set within the Department of Health Code of Practice for Aquatic Facilities. If any significant capital works commence on the existing facility, the Shire would be required to upgrade all areas to comply with the code.

In 2015, the Shire commissioned a condition report of the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre. Donovan Payne & Commercial Aquatics inspected the facility and a copy of the report is attached (Attachment 12.3.6a).

After reviewing the report and water consumption figures, the Aquatic Centre was reduced to a shorter season in 2015/16; operating 3 months as opposed to the usual 5. This was advertised in October 2015 along with the information that 'the Pool is without doubt in its last season in the 2015/2016 season and major Capital works will be budgeted in the 2016/2017 year.' It was intended that a feasibility study would begin at the start of 2016 and that the study would inform the community and the Shire on a way forward by the time of the adoption of the Shire's 2016/17 Annual Budget. Unfortunately progress towards this lost traction due to the changes in CEO's over the last 12 months and the Bencubbin Multi-purpose Complex redevelopment project.

In the adoption of the 2016/17 Annual Budget, Council agreed that in the absence of any community input and dollar figures, the necessary studies into the upgrade or relocation of the pool would have to come out of the annual operating budget for the Aquatic Centre thereby necessitating a reduced season, if any. Ratepayers were informed of the likely closure of the pool when rate notices were mailed out, the same information was published in the Shire Newsletter on the 29th August 2016.

In August 2016, Geoff Ninnes Fong & Partners were engaged to review all documentation on the condition of the pools, to inspect the aquatic facility and to prepare a brief report on the options available to the Shire of Mt Marshall. A copy of the report is attached (Attachment 12.3.6b).

At the September 2016 Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved as follows:

Once the results of the geotechnical investigation are received, it will be possible to scope and commission an engineering report which is the first action identified in the *Mt Marshall Sporting and Recreation Master Plan*. Once the engineering report is to hand, a needs analysis will be commissioned to confirm community need and to assist the case for government financial assistance if a redevelopment or refurbishment was to take place.

COMMENT:

Following the advertising of the impending closure of the Aquatic Centre, the Shire received no formal opposition from the community. However in recent weeks, the Bencubbin P&C, Mt Marshall Swim Club, Bencubbin Primary School and Bencubbin Community Recreation Council have raised questions regarding the decision and requested the Aquatic Centre open for a shorter season (December, February & March). These months would align with swimming lessons for the schools, the swimming carnival and swim club.

The following information will need to be taken into consideration in determining if the pool should open in 2016/17;

Staffing & Training

The Aquatic Centre requires a qualified pool manager to operate and manage the pool throughout the season. In 2015/16, the position was rotated between 4 casual employees, the Community Development Officer is also a qualified pool manager and manages the centre and staff. It is yet to be determined if past staff members would be interested in returning to work for another season. Staff are required to update their qualifications each year, however this has not taken place and as such no staff are currently qualified. They would require attending training sessions in Perth to requalify.

Patronage

Staff have observed a decline in attendance in recent years. With the establishment of new Aquatic facilities in Trayning and Mukinbudin, community members are favouring attending pools in our neighbouring Shires. In 2015/16 the facility had a total of 1979 patrons attend the pool between Dec - March, 18 days of which had less than 5 people through the gate and 28 days had less than 10 people. In 2014/15 the facility had a total of 2361 patrons between Nov– March.

Vacswim, In-term lessons, swim club and community events are the busiest days at the centre. At this stage no events have been planned for 2016/17. Vacswim will not be available at Mt Marshall this December due to the uncertainty surrounding the pool opening this year. To allow the Department of Education time for planning of the 2016 Vacswim program early advice of Mt Marshall's withdrawal was given to the Department. Mukinbudin, Koorda and Trayning will all be offering Vacswim at their Aquatic Centres in December.

Setting up

The 50m pool is emptied every off season. It takes staff approximately one month to get the centre ready to open. This involves filling the pool, ordering and setting up chemicals, balancing chemicals to ensure water quality meets regulations, cleaning the facility and sending water samples off for testing. If the centre is to open for a short season this would need to be taken into consideration as staff availability through the holiday season and water quality test results could slow down this process.

Budget

The Aquatic Centre operational costs are increasing each calendar year. A copy of expenditure and income for the last 9 years can be found in attachment 12.3.6c. Notably the water costs for Nov – March in 15/16 were \$19,627. An increase of nearly \$5,000 from the same months in 16/17 (\$14,639).

If the centre is opened for a shorter season (late Jan – early March) it is likely to incur similar expenditure to the 2015/16 season. Although there is expected to be a reduction in electricity, wages and maintenance, the costs of chemicals, freight and water have increased. As no maintenance on the pool bowl cracks has been completed in the off season it is likely the facility will lose more water.

The Department of Sport & Recreation currently offer \$32,000 worth of funding for Regional Pools through the Community Pools Revitalisation Program. The deadline for this funding has closed and we were not successful in receiving it due to the uncertainty of the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre's future. Unfortunately using this kind of grant for strategic planning does not fit within the guidelines of the funding. If the pool was to open for a shorter season enquiries could take place regarding whether the Shire would still be eligible, however guidelines also state the centre must be open for a minimum of 3 months.

Report outcomes

The Donovan Payne & Commercial Aquatics Condition Report and Geoff Ninnes Report both highlight significant issues with the existing centre that need to be recognised. While the centre has continued to meet water quality standards in past seasons, the water turnover rate poses an increased health risk amongst other issues. The pool also closed earlier than planned in 2016 as the pool was turning green again. This has

happened in past years toward the end of the season and requires daily sweeping of the pool bowl by staff to maintain. The cause of the green has not been determined, while it does not appear to effect the water quality it is unappealing and worrying for patrons to see.

While the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre provides a great benefit to the community the condition of the facility has been deemed as at the end of its useful life in the condition reports by Aquatic professionals. In recent years the centre has continued to operate with minor maintenance and repairs undertaken in the off season, rather than continue to 'patch up' these issues it would be in the Shires best interests to redeploy the net loss on pool operations in 16/17 into a feasibility study and needs analysis for the facility. This will provide a way forward for the Shire and is in line with the Shires Sport & Recreation Master Plan. The consequence of this is that the facility would need to remain closed for this season.

Currently, the Shire reimburse the Beacon Primary School for costs associated with transporting students to In-term Swimming Lessons at the Mt Marshall Aquatic Centre. It is proposed that in 2016/17 the Shire reimburse the Beacon Primary School and Bencubbin Primary School for costs associated with transporting students to In-term lessons at the Trayning or Mukinbudin Aquatic Centres.

- (3) When exercising the power referred to in subsection (1)(b) the local government is required to pay the sum secured by, or payable under, a mortgage, lease, tenancy, encumbrance or charge in favour of the Crown in right of the State or a department, agency, or instrumentality of the Crown in right of the State.
- (4) Schedule 6.3 has effect in relation to the exercise of the power referred to in subsection (1).

COMMENT:

As all statutory requirements have now been met, the owners have not come forth and the debt remains outstanding, Section 6.71 of the Local Government Act 1995 allows for the transfer of the land to either the state or the shire. There is no cost associated with the lodgement of the transfer of land, however should Council wish to transfer the land to itself, there will be water rates to pay, to a total of \$1,300.02 and shire rates to a total of \$15,735.00 to write off. The latter has been allowed for in provisions for doubtful debts however the amount owing in water rates is unbudgeted and will require an absolute majority decision of Council to incur expenditure, as per Section 6.8 of the Local Government Act 1995.

It is recommended that the land be transferred to the shire rather than the state as it will then be available for future development or sale. Transferring it to the state is of no value to the shire.

The Shire of Mt Marshall defines recreation as any activity or past-time that promotes the refreshment of health or spirits well-being by through relaxation and enjoyment. These activities include sports, bushwalking, hiking, pushbike and trail bike riding (only where specific tracks exist), picnics and other community social activities.

On approval of activities on Shire of Mt Marshall Reserves by Shire of Mt Marshall a Reserve Use Licence will be issued and will be bound by the conditions of this policy and remain valid for a specified period. This specified period of permission will be set by the Chief Executive Officer.

Activities requiring approval include:

- Drilling
- Quarrying
- Mining activities (not covered by the Mining Act 1978)
- Native plant sSeed collection (native no sandalwood)
- Sandalwood collection
- Plant collection
- Biodiversity survey, and
- Any Otherother activitys specified nominated by the license applicant of a non-recreational nature.

A person wishing to apply to use a reserve for non-recreational activities must complete and sign an 'Application for a Reserve Use Licence to use Reserve Resources' and send it to the Shire of Mt Marshall for consideration.

Licenses for Seed Collection (including sandalwood) will be granted to Mt Marshall residents only.

The approval process will may take up to sixty (60)60 days and response time will dependent on the nature of the proposed activities. A receipt of Resource the Application for Reserve Use Licence application will be issued within thirty (30)30 days of submission. Approval Any approval will be granted or denied by will be at the discretion of the Chief Executive Officer.

Licence applications are assessed by the technical staff of the Shire of Mt Marshall and submitted to the Chief Executive Officer for final approval.

The activities specified within the licence must not exceed the time period allocated determined by the Chief Executive Officer.

If a person wishes to engage in activities in the reserve for a period that is longer than that specified by the Chief Executive Officer, that person must submit an additional <u>Application for Reserve Use</u> <u>Licence Application application</u> to Council requesting an extension.

Where activities <u>that are undertaken</u> differ from those granted <u>by Council under any licence</u>, the Shire of Mt Marshall has the right to halt activities and ban offenders. When activities will differ from those approved by the Chief Executive Officer the proponent must submit an additional *Application for Reserve Use Licence* to the Shire of Mt Marshall before these activities have taken place.

Where activities cause significant harm to the Shire reserve, surrounding land or the environment in general, the Shire of Mt Marshall has the right to halt activities until an investigation is undertaken by the Shire staff to assess damage. If activities are deemed 'safe' the activity can continue. If the activity is deemed 'un-safe' the activity must cease and the Shire of Mt Marshall has the right to claim any damages that have occurred.

<u>Due to the rare nature of Sandalwood (Santalum spicatum) within shire reserves, the harvesting of Sandalwood timber is strictly prohibited.</u>

<u>Licenses for native seed collection on Crown land (which includes all shire reserves) will only be granted to Mt Marshall residents who hold an appropriate native seed collection license issued by the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW) under the provisions of the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950.</u>

Due to the rare nature of sandalwood within Shire managed reserves the Shire of Mt Marshall will only grant four (4) licences to collect sandalwood within the Shire managed reserves at any one time and these parties must have the relevant State Government Department sandalwood collection licence. Preference will be given to Mt Marshall residents who request sandalwood licences.

In addition to the conditions set out in this policy, the licenceelicensee must also adhere to all DPaW licence conditions. identified in the Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) issued Commercial Purposes Licence and Santalum spicatum (Sandalwood) Seed Endorsement. Failure to do so will may result in the Shire shire licence being revoked and a report being sent to DEC outlining the infringement.

The conditions of a Resource Reserve Use Licence are as follows:

- 1. The licence is bound by the conditions set out in the Shire of Mt Marshall Reserve Use Policy.
- 2. Licences are required for all activities other thaen recreation activities.
- 3. A definition of recreation activities can be found in the Resource Reserve Use Policy.
- 4. The licence is provided for a specified time period and the activities must not exceed this time period.
- 5. Activities may continue if an additional licence is sought and approved.
- 6. Licence approval may take up to sixty (60)60 days.
- 7. Licence applications are assessed by the Technical Staff of the Shire of Mt Marshall and submitted to the Chief Executive Officer for final approval.
- 8.7. Activities must not differ from those outlined in the licence application.
- 9.8. If activities will differ an additional licence should be sought.
- 10.9. The Shire of Mt Marshall reserves the right to stop any activities in reserves under its management if these activities: vary from the licence application, break any licence condition or cause adverse impacts to the reserve, the environment or neighbouring land.

- 11.10. The On application and where relevant, the applicant must provide the Shire of Mt Marshall with a copy of their current DEC issued Commercial Purposes Licence and Santalum spicatum (Sandalwood) Seed Endorsement before being considered for a Shire of Mt Marshall Sandalwood Seed Collecting Licence. DPaW native seed collection licence.
- 12.11. If a Shire of Mt Marshall Sandalwood Seed Collectingnative seed collection

 Licence is issued, it is the responsibility of the licenceelicensee to ensure that their DEC DPaW issued Commercial Purposes Licence and Santalum spicatum (Sandalwood) Seed Endorsementlicence remains current for the term of the Shire's licence. Failure to do so will result in their Shire licence being revoked.
- 13. The applicant must provide the Shire of Mt Marshall the location of the parent trees they collected sandalwood and other seed species from (if a seed collection licence). This can be done by using a map. This map and location data will be kept within the Shire of Mt Marshall filing system as a public record of seed collection.
- 14. The applicant must also fill out a seed collection record (available from the Shire of Mt Marshall) for each collection you make (if a seed collection or plant collection licence). A copy of these records must be returned to the Shire of Mt Marshall before the expiry of your licence.
- 45.12. Appropriate hygiene measures will be followed at all times to prevent the spread of plant diseases and pests.
- 46.13. All care will be taken to avoid the disturbance of fauna habitat.
- 47.14. All care will be taken to avoid any disturbance that may lead to soil degradation.

Attached to this report are two spreadsheets.

The first spreadsheet is a listing of all of the Shire's land, building and improvement assets centred on the townships of Beacon and Bencubbin (including Wialki, Welbungin and

Gabbin). The spreadsheet shows a "Fair Value" assigned to each of the assets by the Shire's independent valuation consultants, Griffin Valuation Advisory.

Plant and equipment assets are not included for the purposes of this report.

"Fair Value" is defined as "the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date" which in this case is 30 June 2014. Underlying the definition of "Fair Value" is a presumption that the entity is a going concern without any intention or need to liquidate or otherwise wind up its operations or undertakes a transaction on adverse terms.

Using fair values it is possible to measure the Shire's relative investment in physical infrastructure in the towns of Beacon and Bencubbin as summarised in the following table.

The second spreadsheet provides a brief history of the more significant facilities in both towns, community groups and businesses associated with those facilities, estimated membership levels and the management arrangements.

It provides an insight into the social capital attached to facilities maintained by the Shire noting that in three instances, the Shire does not actually own the land on which the service is provided (Bencubbin Masonic Lodge, old Bencubbin Police Station and Dajoin Rock radio repeater).

A lack of time has meant that it was not possible to include other community based assets in the report such as the Silver Chain, schools and other government based services and facilities.

Accordingly it is recommended that this report be received as an interim report and subject to Council being satisfied with the format of the report, that it be circulated to the Beacon Progress Association, the Bencubbin Progress Association and the broader community seeking feedback on the audit including the nomination of other non-Shire services and facilities.

COMMENT:

It is important to note that the Fair Value of each facility (totalling \$14,136,607) does not equate to Reinstatement with New Value (totalling in excess of \$30m).

Fair Values have only be used for relative comparisons.

It should also be noted that road and roadside infrastructure (kerbing, street lighting, drainage, footpaths and kerbing) have not been included. That's because the Shire's accounting system does not allow the easy extraction of meaningful data. It is intended that any further report to Council will provide a physical audit of this infrastructure.

Given that harvest is about to go in to full swing and the New Year recess follows, it is recommended that there be an extended period of community consultation with a further report being presented to Council in February 2017.
