BUSHFIRE INFORMATION

Shire of Mt Marshall Bush Fire Act 1954

Restricted Burning Time

All burning is **Restricted** in the Shire of Mt Marshall from **Wednesday 1 February 2017 to Wednesday 15 March 2017.** During this time a Permit to Burn is required.

Farmers are advised that Permits will only be issued on a daily basis and are reminded that certain conditions are endorsed on the Permit.

One important condition is that burning cannot be carried out on the day if a Very High, Extreme or above Fire Danger has been issued by the Bureau of Meteorology.

Please check BOM website for further information or contact your nearest Bush Fire Control Officer.

Permits can be issued by Jack Walker at the Shire office and permit holders are also reminded to read the "Obligations of the permit holder" prior to burning.

BURNING OF GARDEN REFUSE AND RUBBISH

Garden refuse and rubbish may be burnt at any time, day or night, in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of sparks or burning material. Garden refuse and rubbish burnt on the ground may be burnt only between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and 11 o'clock of the same day and must be completely extinguished no later than midnight on that day.

If you are considering burning garden refuse please ensure that you do not leave the fire unattended and have running water available.

During this period there are still **Extreme** weather conditions and care should be taken before considering any burning.

VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP PROGRAM—NOMINATIONS ARE NOW OPEN Training opportunity for young emergency services leaders

The Australian Institute for Disaster Resilience (AIDR) has released dates for the Western Australian session of the Volunteer Leadership Training Program.

The 2017 Volunteer Leadership Program (VLP) is a dynamic, immersive two-day residential program for emergency sector volunteers with aspiration and aptitude to support their organisation's leadership.



It is a personally challenging and richly rewarding experience aimed at providing you with the foundations for capability and confidence for leadership. In taking part, you will be part of a collaborative learning experience, participating alongside volunteer leaders from other emergency management focused agencies, and generating knowledge and sharing experience.

The program provides an introduction to Volunteer Leadership and Management and will be attended by a range of emergency services and not-for-profit volunteers who are involved in emergency response and recovery.

The first course will take place in Perth from Friday 31 March to Sunday 2 April.

All course costs covered by AIDR. Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) will cover some additional incidental costs.

DFES is seeking applications from emerging Volunteer Emergency Services leaders under the age of 30.

HOW TO APPLY

For volunteers looking to nominate themselves, follow the below process:

- Complete the AIDR application form available from the AIDR website or the Shire office
- Submit the form to your local District Officer for approval.

The Academy will review, approve and submit the applications for AIDR's consideration.

Please note:

Nominations must be received by the Academy by close of business Friday 17 February. Volunteers must allow time for their District Officer to process and approve the nomination prior to the closing date for the Academy.

AIDR makes the final decision about successful nominations for the program; this is not decided by DFES. DFES will recognise attendance but the course is not accredited to current training pathways.
