BACKGROUND:

In June 2006 the Shire of Mt Marshall and the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council (Bencubbin CRC), entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that dictates the roles and responsibilities of both parties in regards to the management of the Bencubbin Recreation Grounds. The MOU was not due for review until May 2009, however there were several areas identified by the Shire and the Bencubbin CRC as being unclear. In April 2008 I started reviewing the existing MOU and amended the agreement to clarify the areas that were vague.

An MOU was drawn up and taken to the May 2008 Council Meeting. There were still several areas that were unclear within this MOU, therefore Council requested that the MOU be modified to cover these areas and brought back to the June Meeting.

The following decision was made at the June 2008 meeting of Council:

2008/136 COUNIL DECISION:

That the attached Memorandum of Understanding between the Shire of Mt Marshall and the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council, for the management of the Bencubbin Recreation Grounds, with the inclusion of pest treatment and rubbish bins, be endorsed by Council and be sent to the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council for their endorsement.

The Memorandum was re-sent to the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council for endorsement. In August 2010 the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council asked for several more changes to be made to the agreement. These changes were made and the document returned to them for endorsement.

At the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council General Meeting on 12 April 2011, the Memorandum of Understanding was raised once again. It was pointed out by the Mt Marshall Agricultural Society that the old bar, exhibition hall, sheep yards, shearing shed and horse yards are theirs; therefore they should not be included in the Memorandum of Understanding between the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council and the Shire.

The Memorandum of Understanding was updated and presented to the April Council meeting for endorsement, however the item was deferred to the May meeting to allow members of the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council further time to consider the agreement.

A copy of the agreement was sent to the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council. They were informed that Council had deferred the item until the May Council meeting, therefore if they wish to make any changes, to submit them by 10 May 2011.

COMMENT:

I received a request for several changes from Mrs Jenny Hogan (Treasurer). These changes have been included in the attached document and the Bencubbin Community Recreation Council Committee was notified of the changes. No further requests for changes were received. I ask that Council endorse the attached Memorandum of Understanding for the management of the Bencubbin Recreation Complex. Once Council has endorsed the Memorandum of Understanding, a copy will be sent to the Bencubbin Community Recreation Committee for their endorsement.

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BACKGROUND:

As part of the Forward Capital Works Plan, the top two priority projects were the Beacon Shop and the Bencubbin Community Resource Centre. Both projects were allocated funding in the 2011/2012 financial year.

With capital projects for 2010/2011 being mostly completed, these two priority projects have been moved forward to ensure completion in the 2011/2012 financial year. In order to move the Bencubbin Community Resource Centre building forwards, at the 2010/2011 budget review in February, Council allocated \$10,000 for building plans to be developed in order that the project is ready to proceed in the 2011/2012 financial year budget.

I have worked with both the Bencubbin Community Resource Centre Committee and The Gimlet Newspaper Committee to develop plans for the building. I have also explored funding avenues to be able to assist with the project. Given the cost of the building a tender for the construction of the building will be required.

COMMENT:

Architectural design company, Design Synergy are currently working on plans for the proposed building, but these will not be ready until July 2011. An expression of interest for the construction of the building is required to determine the cost of the project for budgeting purposes and to start applying for grants for the project.

There are three main purposes for using an EOI:

- 1. to determine the level of market competition and develop a shortlist; or
- 2. to collect information for a decision about whether the project will proceed; or
- 3. to collect information to refine the Specification.

The EOI stage is the first of a two-stage process. Following the close of the EOI, the Shire may proceed to the calling of a restricted Request for Tender (RFT). The issuing of an EOI does not commit the Shire to proceed with an RFT.

Eligibility to participate in the RFT will be restricted to providers who comply with the provisions of this EOI and who are accepted by the Shire to be placed on a pre qualified shortlist.

The submission of an EOI does not commit the Shire to include any organisation on the shortlist in the event that the project proceeds.

COMMENT:

MRWA advised recently that due to a shortfall in funding required to fix the extensive flood damaged roads in regional areas within the state this year, that all eight (8) rural RRG's in the state would get their 2011/12 SGLRF funding cut proportionally by approx 8.6% to make up the shortfall. Consequently our WNE SRRG was advised that our 2011/12 Road program was to be cut by \$201,940, and we agreed at our last WNE SRRG meeting held 18 April 2011, that each of the eight (8) member Councils would reduce their program proportionally by 8.6%. The Shire of Mt Marshall's program will be reduced by \$37,371.

I have recommended that the lowest scoring project be amended. The project selected is the widening and primersealing on the Bencubbin / Beacon Rd sections from SLK 24.02 – 25.17, 26.11 – 27.30, and 28.03 – 30.87. I propose to reduce the project by 1.17km on the last section that is now to be worked on between SLK 28.03 to 29.70, giving a new total project length of 4.01km. The total project cost has been reduced proportionally from \$256,800 to \$200,744.

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BACKGROUND:

In December 2009 Council received a request from the Department of Regional Development and Lands that in the event that the Waters and Rivers Commission had no further use for the reserve would Council have any objections to the reserve being cancelled and the land being included into the adjoining freehold Lot 14385 (TE & JE Probert) along with the road reserve on either side of the reserve. Council advised the Department that it had no objections to the proposal.

After a follow up letter from Council, correspondence was received on 11 March 2011 advising that the matter had been held in abeyance pending clarification from the Department of Water as to the future of the reserve.

The Department was also concerned that cancelling the road reserve would remove any opportunity to provide legal access to Lot 14409 (also owned by TE & JE Probert).

An email (attachment 10.6.2b) received on 14 April 2011 has confirmed that the Department of Water has advised that the reserve is surplus to its requirements and

the Department will now commence action to cancel the reserve, once it has been advised of Council's position in regard to access to Lot 14409.

Another solution that could be considered is to dedicate a portion of the Reserve and not close any of the road. A resolution would be required requesting the dedication of that portion of the Reserve in accordance with section 56 of the Land Administration Act 1997.

COMMENT:

In the event that the land (Lot 14409) was sold separately the dedication of portion of the reserve to the road reserve would enable access to the property.

BACKGROUND:

In September 2009 the Minister for Planning announced the release of the discussion paper *Implementing Development Assessment Panels in Western Australia*, which outlines the proposed justification for the introduction of DAPs in Western Australia.

In response to requests for submissions on the discussion paper, Council resolved the following at its November 2009 meeting:

2009/273 COUNCIL DECISION / OFFICER RECOMMENDATION:

That:

- 1. Council advise the Department of Planning that they do not support the proposed implementation of Development Assessment Panels;
- 2. The attached Public Submission Form on Development Assessment Panels be forwarded to the Department of Planning, local Members of Parliament, Minister for Planning and parliamentary backbenchers; and

3. Council seek support from the Shires of Koorda, Wyalkatchem, Trayning and Mukinbudin for this resolution.

However, on 24 March 2011, the *Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panels) Regulations 2011* (the regulations) were gazetted. These Regulations establish the operational framework for Development Assessment Panels (DAPs).

Prior to the legislating of the regulations, all planning decisions were solely at the Council's discretion. Now, applications for development in a district outside of the City of Perth with an estimated cost of \$7 million or more are required to be considered by a DAP. Developers may request that applications below \$7 million but above \$3 million be considered by the DAP, and Council has the option to voluntarily refer applications to the DAP.

Each DAP will consist of 5 members; 3 specialist members, one being the presiding member, and two local government members.

Correspondence (attached) has been received from the Minister for Planning; Culture & the Arts requesting (under regulation 26) the nomination of four elected members; two members and two 'alternate', or deputy members, to serve on the local DAP.

Nominations are due by 13 June 2011. Should no nominations from the Shire of Mt Marshall or, I imagine, less than four nominations be received, the Minister has the power to include on the local government register a person who is 'an eligible voter of the local government district' 'who has relevant knowledge or experience'. Any nominations put forth must be formally approved by the Minister.

It will also be mandatory for members to attend training before they can sit on a DAP. I have requested further information on training requirements such as the duration, venue and cost of the training. I have also queried who is to bear the cost of members attending the 'mandatory' training, including accommodation should training not be offered locally.

In consultation by telephone with Ms Robyn Barrow at the Department of Planning, an eligible DAP member (not employed in the public sector) who successfully completes training is entitled to the payment of \$400 from the Department. The \$400 payment is to cover costs to the member including motor vehicle and travel expenses at the rate decided from time to time by the Public Sector Commissioner for members of Government boards and committees'.

Ms Barrow explained that local members will not be required to participate in training until such a time that Mt Marshall receives an application requiring the attention of the DAP. This could be many years into the future.

The Minister encourages Councils to consider the October 2011 Local Government Elections when nominating members as the term of office on a DAP will be for two years, expiring in April 2013.

COMMENT:

It would appear that the requirement for the DAP to meet would be minimal.

Council should bear in mind that three members' terms (Cr.'s IN Miguel, DA Miguel and RN Breakell) will expire in October this year. Should any of these three members be appointed to the DAP and not be re-elected in October the deputy DAP member/s will take his place.

Council may choose to nominate up to two members and two deputies to sit on the DAP, or alternatively allow the Minister to make the choice.

Staff are unable to serve on the local DAP.

Section 4.61 of the Local Government Act 1995 Provides guidance on the choice of methods of conducting an election. Elections may be conducted as either a postal election or a voting in person election. If an election is to be held as a postal election then it must be passed by an absolute majority of council at least 80 days before the election is held.

COMMENT:

A postal vote election can only be run by the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC). For the 2009 Election the quote to run a postal vote election received from the WAEC was \$6,818. This did not include non-statutory advertising however this would be a nil cost for the shire.

To run an in-person election, as was chosen in 2009, the estimated cost would be \$3,500. An in-person election still allows the voter to elect to use a postal vote as well as the ability to use an early and absent vote. In 2009 the voter turnout was over 80%.

The method of election can be changed not less than 80 days before the election by an absolute majority decision of council however by setting the method now it would assist with budget preparation.
