COMMENT:

Before disposing of property, it was a requirement prior to November 2009 that a valuation be carried out not more than six months earlier than the proposed disposition. The Local Government Act was amended in November 2009 to allow Councils the discretion to use a valuation more than six months old (with or without amendment.

Any disposition of property would still need to be advertised in accordance with the Act.

Apart from Bencubbin Smash Repairs, the nearest panel beater is in Merredin, Wongan Hills and Northam.

The details of a proposed disposition that are required by subsection (3)(a)(ii) include:

- (a) the names of all other parties concerned; and
- (b) the consideration to be received by the local government for the disposition; and
 - (c) the market value of the disposition
 - (i) as ascertained by a valuation carried out not more than 6 months before the proposed disposition; or
 - (ii) as declared by a resolution of the local government on the basis of a valuation carried out more than 6 months before the proposed disposition that the local government believes to be a true indication of the value at the time of the proposed disposition.

BACKGROUND:

Following Council's decision at the March 2010 ordinary meeting where tenders received for the provision of similar housing on the same lot under tender MM04/10, were not accepted and another tender for the provision of site built dwellings or Kits only was requested, this tender was advertised in the West Australian on the 20th March 2010. Tender MM05/10 closed on 9 April 2010 and Council has received five (5) tenders from four (4) various housing manufacturing companies to provide either two (2) x Site Built or Kits only for 2 bedroom + storeroom Dwellings on Lot 92 Monger St, Bencubbin. The results of the tender are shown on the Tender results and Summary sheet attached (refer to attachment 10.5.2a).

COMMENT:

The specification for these dwellings was very similar to the specification of last year's housing Tender MM05/09 for the two (2) x dwellings that are presently located on Lot 93 Monger St, Bencubbin. The main differences between the specifications being that the dwellings in this tender specification include/exclude:

- The approx six (6) required split systems for the two dwellings were excluded, so that Council can get these installed by our preferred contractor at a later date.
- 2. A "gas" wall oven in lieu of an "electric" wall oven mainly to reduce the demand on available power.
- 3. A Solar Water Heater with storage tank on the roof was specified in this tender, so that we do not receive tenders with Solar Water Heaters with ground based water tanks and subsequent additional required pumps, as we did for the existing two (2) new dwellings from Transteel that are located adjacent on Lot 93 Monger St. Also specifying that the tenderer is to allow for their contractor to install these Solar Hot water systems onsite, and not just supply them for Council's contractor's to install at our cost.

As can be seen from the Recommendation Report (see attachment 10.5.2b), the main points of interest are:

- a) The Evaluation Panel considered the Alternative Tender from Parkzone P/L to supply two x "Georgia" Transportable dwellings to site and crane them into position, to be non-compliant due to the lack of sufficient tender submission documentation, and therefore this tender was not assessed further.
- b) The Evaluation Panel considered the design from Parkzone P/L for their "Georgia" dwelling design (for both their compliant site built dwellings tender submission and their Alternative Tender mentioned in a) above, to be an impractical design.
- c) The Evaluation panel considered the tender from L&T Transportables & Kit Homes for the supply of Dwelling Kits only was not good value to Council as compared to the other three (3) remaining compliant site built dwelling tenders. The costs to engage a suitable building contractor to provide the remaining outstanding materials and build each dwelling (given the tendered base kits) were estimated, and with consideration of the hidden costs (via loss of staff time that would be required to manage the completion of these dwellings onsite), it was decided that this option would be comparatively more costly given the costs of the base kits tendered.
- d) The tendered submission prices for the remaining three (3) compliant tenders for the provision of two (2) site built dwellings only, varied by \$93,445 with the tender submission from ICS Carpentry being the lowest priced tender at \$404,305. This tender submission also gained the highest score evaluated against the qualitative criteria.
- e) Given that Council has recently accepted tenders for two very similar dwellings, being:
 - i) \$428,617 including GST for the two x Transteel "Avalon" 2 bedroom + study dwellings currently located on Lot 93 Monger St, Bencubbin (that also included additionally specified approximately \$20,000 of split systems), and
 - ii) \$390,289 including GST for the two x Fleetwood Homes "Custom Sherlock" 2 bedroom + storeroom dwellings ordered for Lots 37 & 38

Rowlands St in Beacon (that has 45m2 less verandah area and the only specification difference being these will come with single carports rather than double carports as specified in this tender's specification),

then comparatively the Evaluation Panel considered that the tender price of \$404,305 including GST from ICS Carpentry to site build the two specified dwellings in this tender would be good value to Council.

For the above reasons the evaluation panel has recommended that this tender be awarded to ICS Carpentry.

Total funds to complete these dwellings have not been provided in the current budget, however as it is unlikely that they will be commenced immediately, the funds available should cover initial payments required by ICS Carpentry. Provision will be made for the balance of this project in the 2010/11 Budget.

BACKGROUND:

A request has been received from Mrs Jenni Bunce to restrict large trucks from entering the Beacon Caravan Park. The main reason for her request is that large trucks create a dust bowl of the road surface and the dust is then transferred to all the buildings. There is also the issue of late arrivals and early departures that has an impact on other park residents.

COMMENT:

This problem would normally arise whilst Marley's are carting grain to Beacon as they have a caravan stationed in the park to use as kitchen facilities and they also use the ablutions. They would then sleep in their trucks in the park.

It might be more appropriate if we suggested to Marley's and other contractors with large trucks that they park at the barracks and use the kitchen and ablution facilities at the barracks.

The other option is that they be requested to leave their trucks at the wheat bin.

There is no issue at the Bencubbin caravan park.

Expenditure requirements for the renewal of the road network is able to be ascertained quite easily from the data provided in Romans, however maintenance requirements for buildings are another matter.

To this end it is proposed to engage the services of ICS Carpentry to provide a five year maintenance plan for all the major public buildings in the shire. The rationale behind this move is the fact that Ian Sanders has been maintaining most of Council's buildings over the past few years and will no doubt be engaged to carry out necessary maintenance for some time in the future.

The Department for Regional Development and lands has indicated that assistance in the development of the above plans should be sought from their preferred supplier panel, however, as yet, there is no preferred supplier panel and they have suggested we look at the WALGA preferred supplier panel.

I have obtained indicative figures from several suppliers on WALGA's panel and have come to the conclusion that a more meaningful asset management plan would be achieved using ICS Carpentry and our own engineer.

The Department of Regional Development and Lands has funding available (up to \$35,000 per Council, however applications close on 30 April 2010.

COMMENT:

One clear message from the many (sometimes conflicting) messages being received on the forward planning issue is the fact that without the "appropriate" strategic, asset management and forward capital works plans being finalised, we will not be in a position to access any of the 2010/11 Country Local Government Fund.
